# **Getting to South Shore Lodge**

Though there are no roads direct to the lodge, we're easy to reach. Access to our peaceful, secluded setting is by floatplane or by driving to our private landing and being met by boat.

Via the paved Manitou Road, Hwy 502 (Fort Francis-Dryden), the landing is 110 miles from the International Falls border station.

Guests choosing to drive will be provided with a good map. Once at the landing, it's a short boat ride past the islands to camp.

**South Shore Lodge** should be your destination for this year's vacation if your interests are trophy muskie, walleye, northern pike, smallmouth bass, trout fishing or simply relaxing in a unique wilderness retreat. Here, the busy world of traffic and tension is left far behind as our shuttle boat brings you to this picturesque location. Remotely situated on the south shore of Eagle Lake, in Northwest Ontario, the lodge is surrounded by some of Canada's best fishing water.

## **Eagle Lake**

Although a large body of water (68,000 acres... over 400 miles of shoreline), the many bays, islands and points surrounding South Shore Lodge make the lake quite friendly and sheltered around here, not to mention the great fish habitat such structure provides. Located in a narrow part of Eagle, you'll have all the fishing you ever want nearby, with no concern for what the wind is doing. Guided fishermen travel a long distance to our area, knowing the well-deserved reputation of Eagle Lake's south shore waters. Though we do have guides for hire, they are usually fishing solo each day to keep on top of the fish and assist wherever possible in your success. Because of our location, we find hiring guides unnecessary for you to

access the prime fishing areas of Eagle. We ARE where the fishing IS on Eagle. We will sit down and go over a map with you upon arrival at camp. We are on the dock morning and evenings talking about where we would try and how to pursue the different species of fish. This map will also work for navigation, and

because you don't need to travel long distances to fish, getting lost won't happen during your stay at South Shore Lodge. Even with all these advantages, we feel the best is that you will not see another lodge, cottage, or traffic during your whole stay. We are

peaceful, secluded, and miles from the "hustle and bustle," yet modern and clean. We are still a fishing lodge and not a recreational resort as so many have become.

## **Fishing**

For the Muskie fisherman, the lake holds a special attraction. They know that the lake has produced 60 pound trophies and has, in the past, held the World's record for muskie. Each summer brings in several "once in a lifetime" trophies.

> Walleye fishermen might well find the lunker for their wall to enjoy for a lifetime. Each season seems

to produce a few monster walleye in the 12 to 13 pound class, with many other very impressive size fish caught regularly.

> While waiting for the big ones, all the 2-3 pound walleye are good fun to catch and a

delicious shorelunch.

Northern Pike are prolific in Eagle Lake. They are eager to attack any bait you're using and don't seem to care whether you are a beginner or expert. 25 pound pike are not

common here (we think the 100 pound muskies probably eat them) but

fish over half that size are taken regularly.


#### Smallmouth Bass and Lake Trout

#### Don't forget your camera!


Between the big fish, wilderness scenery, displays of spectacular northern lights, and active wildlife, there will be lots of memories for you to capture.
